

## LIQUOR LICENSE DEFINITIONS

- **Class "A" Beer License** is to sell **BEER** products for **OFF-premises** consumption. \$100
- **Class "B" Beer License** is to sell **BEER** products for **ON-premises** consumption. \$100
- **Class C Wine License** is to sell **WINE** for **ON-premises** consumption. This license is for restaurants in which the sale of wine accounts for less than 50% of gross receipt. License can be held in conjunction with a Class "B" Beer license. \$100
- **"Class A" Liquor License** is to sell **LIQUOR** in packages for **OFF-premises** consumption. (Most commonly used by liquor stores and convenience stores.) \$500
- **"Class B" Liquor License** is to sell **LIQUOR and WINE** for **ON-premises** consumption. This is commonly referred to as a "full liquor license". Currently there are none available at this time. \$500
- **QUOTA PLUS "Class B" Liquor License** is license is specific for full-service restaurants with a minimum \*permanent, \*indoor seating capacity of 300 seats. This license is to sell **BEER, LIQUOR & WINE** for **ON-premises** consumption. The license can also be issued to any hotel with a minimum of 50 rooms that has a restaurant with 150 seats or a banquet facility with a minimum 400 person capacity. Initial fee is \$10,000. Renewal fee if \$600  
\*New licenses issued after 6/1/2016 cannot use outdoor seating in their 300 seat count.
- **Temporary Class "B" (Picnic) License** can ONLY be issued to "bona fide clubs", churches, lodges, chamber of commerce or similar organizations, or veteran organizations that have been in existence for at least six months. License is to sell beer and/or wine at short term special events. Only 2 licenses to sell wine can be issued per year. No limit for beer. There must be licensed operators on duty at the event. Licenses issued for "wine walks" can be used at up to 20 locations twice a year.
